- 4. Teacher Share 5:45 pm start
- This month we hear from the Physical Education / Well-Being / Health and Music / Band team's Music / Band learning highlights include
- a) Learning intentions are to instill an enjoyment of music in students, raise their awareness of the wide varieties and boost appreciation for the role music plays in cultures and societies
- b) Grade levels focus on early skills and continue to build towards more advanced concepts in later grades, these include singing, dancing and instruments
- c) Beat, rhythm and movement play key roles in class progression as well, exploring ways to enhance and elevate their expressive talents and build confidence along the way
- d) Hearing and matching beat to movement, being mindful of one's whole body while participating in dance
- e) Vocalizations working with singing and other sounds, using vocal techniques like volume change and range as ways to encourage students to find their own unique voices and to harmonize with the voices around them. As students advance areas like enunciation and tune change are incorporated to continue students on their musical journey
- f) Instruments Students are exposed to various instruments as they progress through grade levels, including things like xylophones, various types of drums and shakers then later to wind instruments like the recorder where notes and scales are studied
- g) Band At grades 7-9 students have the option to participate in band where they can choose an instrument to work with and learn, these are fantastic collaborative opportunities where students engage, listen and harmonize together
- h) Assemblies The Music / Band team has been a huge component to the success of several assemblies this year including the Winter Celebration and Kindness Assembly, teachers play a pivotal role in guiding students through all stages of the event planning and program preparation, allowing them to experience a side of music and performance they may have not considered before
- i) Body Percussion Featured heavily and successfully executed by all during the Winter Celebration, students get to clap and stomp their way through the day while learning together in the positive environment provided
- j) Teachers share video of students of all grade levels participating in various classroom activities, many wonderful moments from kindergarten all the way up, music class offers a unique environment where collaboration is even more important and allows students to practice these essential group work skills

Physical Education / Well-Being / Health learning highlights include

- a) Learning intentions are to foster a safe environment for character development, exposing and establishing healthy eating and exercise habits, then extending to financial literacy and essential life planning skills
- b) Grades 7-9 benefit from further areas of study to cover individual wellness goals and choices, guiding them in their learning through complex development stages
- c) So Many Teams! Teachers have done an amazing job of coordinating schedules and gym time to accommodate the many PSS Stars teams that are active and giving students new ways to challenge themselves and experience the camaraderie that comes with competitive team sports
- d) Schedules are also shared and presented detailing how the gym time is allocated among grade levels and allows for 3 classes per week for K-6 and 4 per week for 7-9
- e) This regular physical activity time for all students helps them build motor skills and competency, communication, cooperation and teamwork activities. Teachers maintain keen observance of skill development opportunities and areas of strength that allow them to give students the best possible avenues for further success
- f) Gym class is its own unique environment also, it's a place people can be a bit more loud than usual, get some emotions out in positive physical ways, work hard and reach new limits. Many ways exist to benefit from this learning tool and the PSS team has used them all to enhance the daily experience for many students
- g) Introduction of new games! Almost everyday someone is learning something new here, new games are

explained and listening skills exercised as rules and steps are detailed, using these skills here prepares students for future classroom situations

- h) Health and Wellness curriculum discussion, teachers share the year long plan and how specific sections will be delivered, the classroom portion is balanced along with gym time to allow a change of pace during the year and allowing students to make the most of the learning goals
- i) Parent Roles Teachers reiterate and provide key information for the best ways parents can participate and remain aware like an emotional check in, regular communication and reminders for children that they have trusted adults they can approach. This kind of home support will make the impact teachers can deliver even greater and see more of our student's potential realized
- j) Teachers showcase the Google Classroom platform and showcase how it contains all related information to classroom activities and contact details for teachers allowing easy access for parents

- a) We have a guest today from a local charity who comes offering a service that may allow us better access to funding. She has experience with this and has worked with other schools, often acting as a liaison with various organizations making navigating often complex regulations much easier for our council
- b) Cindi provides examples of how money can be allocated and types of supplies provided in past programs. She advises us to review our needs and return to her with a list of items or supplies that can be utilized at our school.
