- Staff have prepared presentations of classroom activities, this month we heard from the Physical Education, Music and Grade 3 teams.
- -Physical Education learning highlights include
- a) Developing a meaningful focus for all age groups K-9
- b) Delight Fostering a enjoyment of physical activities
- c) Motor Competence Skill development, balance, coordination and improving individual ability, goal setting and accomplishing.
- d) Social Skills Creating fun social environments for peer interaction and making friends
- e) Personally Relevant Designing curriculum that considers students cultural backgrounds and personal experiences.

General Information Re: Physical Education Program

- -Competitive athletic programs for Cross Country and Badminton are in place
- -Athletic jerseys design and colors have been selected and shown to attendees
- Mental Health focus, teaching emotional awareness, regulation techniques like breathing exercises and lessons of sympathy / empathy for peers
- A focus on Emotional Awareness, understanding the spectrum of emotions and how they can flow from one to another, awareness of this shifting and transforming process will benefit student well-being.
- -Teachers have exceptionally adapted to the challenges of limited gym access, making great use of available spaces to teach physical education in
- Music learning highlights include
- a) A early enjoyment of music
- b) Awareness and appreciation of a variety of sounds and insights into music gained through activities
- c) Encouraging student self-expression and creativity
- d) Music skills and knowledge, concepts such as rhythm, harmony, melody, form and expression. Skills such as singing, instruments, movement and listening.

Grade 1 – Building foundations of music to develop further understanding in later grades. Utilizing the voice for both speaking and singing, an early introduction to music notes and vocal changes. Importance of audience manners and showing respect for performers. Lessons in keeping beat and the interaction between beat and rhythm.

Grade 2 - Continue to build and develop foundational skills. Introduction of new music notes, a focus on contrasts of vocal ranges high, medium and low, recognition of different types of voices. More complex rhythms introduced as well as theory concepts like pauses, rests and whole rests.

Grade 3 – Students working with wind instruments, goals to avoid squeaking, proper hand placements and motions for fluidic note playing. Added elements of social studies such as world music and rare / unique sounds

Grade 4 – Adding new musical vocabulary to grow students ability to express their love of music and enhance communication skills. Continued practice on the recorder as well as opportunities to pick up new instruments for first time. More notes introduced and a clear display of further air control while playing, year over year improvement.

Grade 5 – Learning to combine skills from previous years to improve performance, more notes learned and chances to play as a group provided. Expanded on musical vocabulary and at the end of the year concepts of melody and harmony will be taught.

- Grade 3 learning highlights include
- a) Social Studies primarily focused on culture, getting students to explore the idea of what it is, where it comes from and why different cultures exist. Challenge students with world building exercises including map making, placing cities and creating their own environments with unique plants and features.
- b) Merging literacy with folktales, oral history and perspective on how these tales are shared, their relevance to tradition.
- c) Currently a strong focus on Ukrainian culture in classroom, teachers are using story time to expose students to Ukrainian holidays and ways of celebrating important days.
- d) Research skills, lessons on how to find and understand new information, as well as presentation skills, using technology to enhance presentations and engage audiences' attention.
- e) Welcoming members of community to come into class as guest speakers and give personal perspectives sharing their experiences with culture.

 - a) Survey's main source of data collection, a survey was sent recently, Mona encourages attendees to complete it
